

Guidelines for Reopening the Church

We were pleased to be able to open the sanctuary for worship last Sunday, May 24th. As we continue to worship together, we will be following CDC guidelines to make sure that all our members and visitors that choose to worship with us are safe. Please bear with us as we try to figure out the "normal". We look forward to seeing everyone.

Changes:

- Hymnals will be removed and replaced with copied sheets inside bulletins.
- Bulletins should be taken out or thrown away after each service.
- Communion plates will not be passed out instead we will have pre-packaged communion placed in the pews
- Hand sanitizer stations will be in the Narthex.
- Face mask will be available if needed.
- Pew cushions will be removed, and Pews will be roped off so that we ensure 6ft social distancing, people who reside in the same household can sit on the same row.
- Offering plates will be placed in the front and in the Narthex
- Please no hugging or handshaking
